



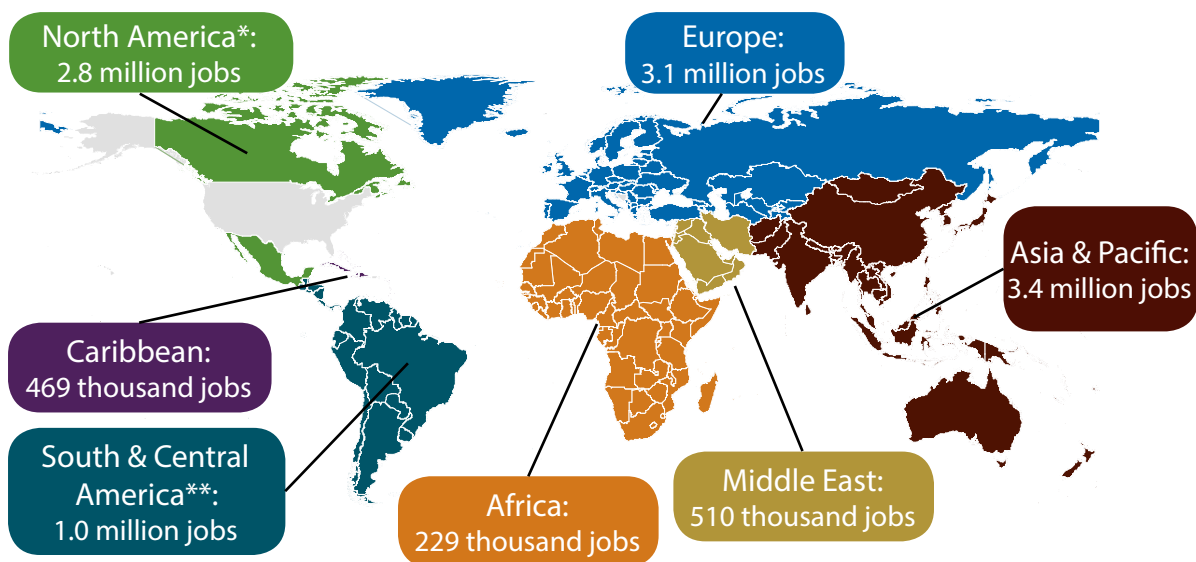

11.5 M Jobs Supported by Total U.S. Goods & Services Exports in 2015

Jobs by Region

- Exports to Canada supported the greatest number of jobs: 1.6 million.
- Other markets where exports supported the most jobs in 2015 were Mexico, China, the United Kingdom, Japan, Germany, Korea, Brazil, Ireland, and the Netherlands.
- Jobs supported by exports to these top 10 markets accounted for 58% of all jobs supported by exports in 2015.

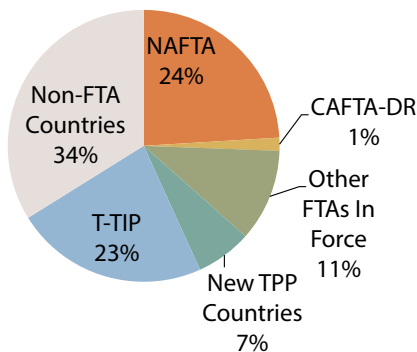

Trade Agreements

- The U.S. has 14 trade agreements in force with 20 countries.
- Total U.S. exports to new partner countries in the proposed TTIP and TPP agreements supported 3.4 million jobs in 2015.

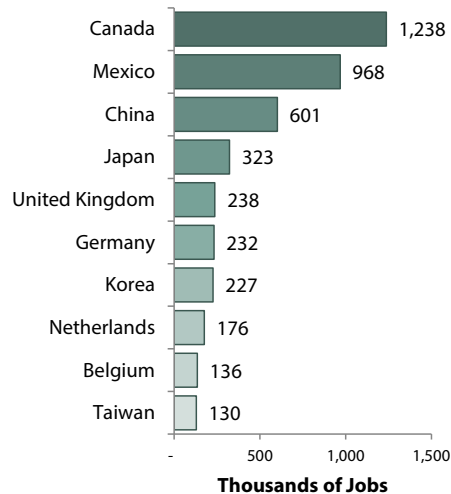

Jobs by Country

- Jobs supported by goods exports to Mexico have increased by 296 thousand since 2009, one-third of total growth in jobs supported by goods exports.
- Jobs supported by service exports to China have grown by 182 thousand since 2009, the largest increase among markets for which there is data.

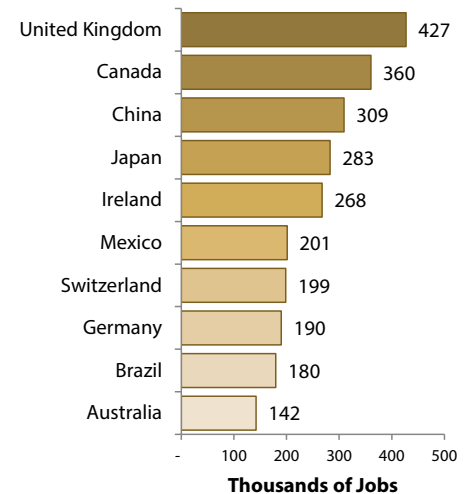
U.S. Goods Exports Supported 6.7 Million Jobs

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Where can I access data for all jobs supported by U.S. exports, by destination?

A: The data file and corresponding report are available on our website at: <http://www.trade.gov/mas/ian/employment>.

Q: Why are there only 71 countries with Jobs Supported by Total Exports figures?

A: Services trade data is only available for 71 countries, and this statistic is needed to calculate the number of jobs supported by total exports.

Q: Can I add jobs supported by total exports figures from several countries together to create a custom jobs-supported figure for a specified region?

A: Yes, for countries with available services data. However, note that because of limited services data, if the custom region contains destinations without services export detail, the number of jobs supported by exports is likely to be underestimated.

Q: Can I add jobs supported by goods exports figures from several countries together to create a custom jobs-supported figure for a specified region?

A: Yes, the figures are additive. For example, to see how many goods exports destined for NAFTA countries supported U.S. jobs, add 1.24 million to 968 thousand to arrive at a total of 2.21 million jobs that were supported by 2015 U.S. goods exports to NAFTA countries.
