Short Research Paper Submissions

All short research paper submissions must include:

- A cover page including the title of the paper, name(s) of author(s) and affiliation(s), confirmation that the presenting author and any other attending authors are or will become a member of both ANZIBA and AIB by the registration date, the lead author's email address, and a chosen track (number and name from the list above).
- The second page of the submission should include the title and main body of the paper. Short research paper submissions should be single-spaced and **not exceed 3,000 words** and generally include a positioning, research question(s), theoretical foundation, method(s) (if applicable), (preliminary) findings, and conclusions. All paper submissions will be subject to a double-blind review process. By default, all accepted papers will be published online by ANZIBA and AIB-Oceania but will only be accessible to conference attendees. If you do not want your paper published in this manner, please inform the Track Co-Chair at the time of acceptance.

A maximum of three submissions as an author or co-author is allowed.

Paper Development Workshop (PDW) Submissions

All full paper submissions to the PDW track must include:

- A cover page including the title of the paper, name(s) of author(s) and affiliation(s), confirmation that attending author(s) are or will become members of both ANZIBA and AIB, and the lead author's email address.
- The second page of the submission should include the title, an abstract, and 3-5 keywords.
- Full papers should be a maximum of 30 pages double-spaced and follow the *Journal of International Business Studies* guidelines. Full papers are desirable but not essential as early-stage ideas with a clear conceptual development and framing are also welcome.

Doctoral Colloquium

The Doctoral Colloquium (DC) will be centred around discussions among participants and academic mentors on the submitted proposals. All DC participants will receive all proposals and are expected to read them and participate actively in the discussions.

How to apply:

- Submit a summary of your proposal (maximum 5 pages, single-spaced), including the following details:
 - your name, email address, university affiliation, PhD area/discipline, number of years in the PhD programme;
 - the title of your thesis/proposal;
 - a brief description of the main components of your research thesis/proposal;
 - a statement confirming that you are (or will become by the registration date at the latest) a member of both ANZIBA and AIB.

Early Career Scholars Day

The Early Career Scholars (ECSs) Day is aimed at early career academics (up to eight years after earning a PhD and holding an academic position) who want to learn more about developing a successful and well-balanced academic career. Preliminary themes include balancing research, teaching and service/citizenship, engaging in collaborations, establishing and pursuing a rewarding research programme, and seeking well-being and avoiding ill-being in academia. The consortium will provide an opportunity to network with peers and learn from experienced and highly successful academics.

How to apply:

- Submit a one-pager summarising:
 - your resume, including your PhD details, current position, research interests, courses you teach, and any academic service roles you hold;
 - 3 to 5 questions you have about your career or about academia more broadly;
 - a statement confirming that you are (or will become by the registration date at the latest) a member of both ANZIBA and AIB.

Mid-Career Scholars Day

Mid-Career Scholars (MCSs) are academics who typically have at least eight years of academic experience, see themselves as having more than five years of a rewarding academic career in front of them, and identify themselves as mid-career academics.

This day-long event is for MCSs interested in gaining insights into strategising about and crafting a career they would define as satisfying and rewarding. Sessions will focus on unpacking some of the distinct demands and challenges MCSs meet as pressure and stresses increase. Discussions will also be devoted to the power of peer mentoring and meaningfully aligning the various parts of academic portfolios. The day will offer good opportunities for MCs to network and learn from each other.

How to apply:

- Submit a one-pager summarising:
 - your resume (current position and institution, number of years of academic experience so far, research interests, courses taught, and citizenship/service/ leadership roles (if any));
 - a paragraph on your motivation behind wanting to participate in the MCS day;
 - a statement confirming that you are (or will become by the registration date at the latest) a member of both ANZIBA and AIB.
