2021 Broad College International Business Case Competition

Competition Rules

Eligibility

- This competition is open to Broad College undergraduate students.
- Each team must consist of 4 students.
- Participants can either:
 - o form a team of 4 students (preferred option) or
 - express interest in the competition and be assigned to a team by organizers
- Entrants will be accepted on a first come first serve basis until the limit of 12 teams is reached.

Case Preparation

- The case will be delivered to the teams by email.
- The case can concern an actual or fictional business situation.
- During the preparation of the case, teams may use various external resources such as textbooks, internet searches, and <u>unpaid</u> databases. This includes information sources provided by MSU and Broad College to students without additional charge.
- No outside help is allowed during the case analysis and write-up, this includes, but not limited to, help from faculty staff, other students, or any non-team member.
- All teams are expected to follow the competition rules and perform with the highest standard of honesty and professionalism.

Presentation Format

- All team members are expected to take an active role in the presentation.
- Teams will have 20 minutes to present their analysis and recommendation.
- Judges will have 10 minutes for questions.
- The presenting team will be given 5- and 1-minute notifications, both during their presentation and during the Q&A.
- Teams are not permitted to watch other teams' presentations.
- Judging rubrics will be shared with the participants on or before October 19, 6.00 pm.
- The dress code for the presentations is business professional.
- Teams must submit their presentation slides in the form of a PowerPoint file (other formats not allowed) by October 28, 11.59 pm. These files will be used for the team presentations (no changes allowed). Late submissions will not be accepted.

Judges

- Judges are selected from professors at Broad College and the members of the business community from different industries.
- Judges will evaluate the teams using a standard rubric.

Awards

- Winning teams will receive the following scholarships:
 - \circ \$2,000 for the 1st place team
 - \$1,200 for the 2nd place team
 - \$800 for the 3rd place team
- Scholarships will be processed as a credit to the students' MSU tuition accounts in the amount of 25% of the team's award for each of the 4 team members.

- October 15, Friday, 11.59 pm. Competition registration deadline.
- October 19, Tuesday, 4.00 pm. Competition orientation and Q&A session (can be conducted online due to the pandemic).
- October 26, Tuesday, 9.00 am. Case released to teams.
- October 28, Thursday, 11.59 pm. Presentation slides submission deadline.
- October 29, Friday. Team presentations.

Special Clauses

- The winning teams (or selected team members) might have an opportunity to represent MSU/Broad College at other major national international business case competitions.
- Competition rules may be subject to change. Teams participating in the competition will be promptly notified of all changes. All changes will have an equal effect on the participating teams.
- COVID-19 information: This case competition will abide by all MSU policies concerning health and safety regarding COVID-19. Specifically, all students in the competition will abide by the vaccine and masking policies as detailed on <u>Together We</u> <u>Will</u>.
